Peek Into Our Past

The *Watchman* county newspaper published news from towns in our area in the late 1800s. Enjoy this month's "Peek Into Our Past."

9/4/1885 – During the storm last Thursday night the house of Mr. Chas. Wardenberg, at Orrville, was struck by lightning and all the inmates knocked senseless for a short time; but fortunately no one was seriously injured.

9/9/1887 – A grand fish-fry was participated in by a party of young ladies and gents who gathered on the banks of the Meramec last Saturday for a day's pleasure. Indeed it will be a day long to be remembered by the little group that assembled on that delightful occasion. Seldom has the old hills and lovely valleys re-echoed the sounds of such merry voices. All seemed to say welcome, thrice welcome. Those present were Mrs. Dick Warfield, Misses Emma Steffens, Agnes Taylor, Emma Essen, Lizzie Sampson, Messrs. Victor Smith, Bolky Henchen, Frank Ornyomouseng and Fred Essen.

9/9/1892 – The St. Louis Cycling Clubs all made runs in the county last Sunday. The South Sides and Cycling Club rode to Ballwin Saturday night. Sunday the South Sides visited Melrose and were entertained at dinner by H. Y. Paffrath.

9/1/1893 – Miss Minnie Stellar opened her school last Monday with a large attendance. Both teacher and pupils are ready for a good year's work.
