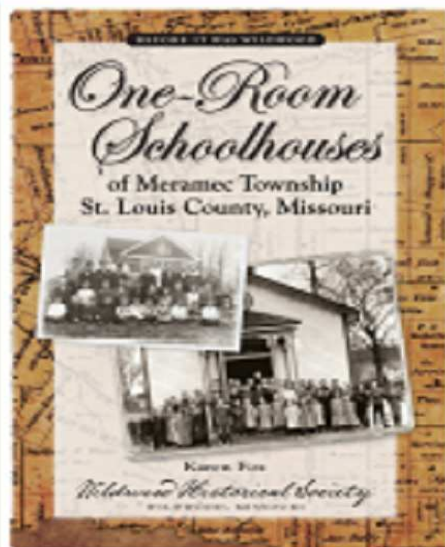

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2012

Peek Into Our Past

The *Watchman* county newspaper published news from towns in our area in the late 1800s. Enjoy this month's "Peek Into Our Past."

10/13/1881 - Well Watched.

When a Judge arrives at the age of 48 years, it is time to watch him, especially when he has served nearly two years on the County bench as Judge Francis Ruwwe has done. No judge deserves watching more than he does, and no one seemed to know it better than his son William, for on Monday morning last, he presented his father, the Judge, with an elegant stem winding gold watch, which his Honor, with pardonable pride, took delight in showing to his friends before taking his seat on the wool sack.

10/22/1886 - Fox Creek Lodge No. 169, A. O. U. W., will have a picnic on Saturday, Oct. 30, at Fox Creek Postoffice, on the Manchester road. Speakers from the city will be present to address and entertain the audience during the day, and at night there will be a grand hop. We hope that all interested in the welfare of the people at large will come out and see and hear what is going on. All are invited, and we hope to have a large attendance and a good time.

10/4/1895 - Quite a number of the younger element of this vicinity attended the picnic given by the Anti-Horse Thief Association at Bonhomme Grove, and reported having enjoyed a most delightful time.

10/4/1895 - Last Sunday the people could safely take a drive on the Rock road without being subjected to meeting bicycles. It must have been too cool for them to turn out, as not a one registered at the Pond hotel, while twenty-five to thirty-five was a common occurrence through the summer.
